PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Fall Festival - is this evening and all are excited. We are expecting a good turnout.

The first quarter grading period has ended. Report cards will be shared with our parents on November 7th during the Parent Teacher conferences.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

State Assessment Data has been released to the public on Tuesday. Last Thursday, we met as a staff and state assessment data was shared and discussed. BES was on the border of being average in reading and math. BES overall is at the orange level which is a low performing elementary school. When looking at the scores and breakdowns BES was about 1/10th of a point from being an average school. TSI (Targeted Support Improvement) - students with disabilities scored 22.5% which puts BES in the bottom 25% in the state so we are identified as a TSI school for Kentucky. We will be sure that our Comprehensive School Improvement Plan is in alignment with improving our plan for students with disabilities. This plan has been reviewed by Central Office and it is felt that we are solid in our plan and going in the right direction for improvement.

Walkthroughs:

BUDGET REPORTS

Activity Budget

Instructional Budget 2022/2023

ESS Budget Revision - ESS Funding is given to us by the state to target students who are behind or struggling. We have hired an ESS support person for 6 hours per day to support these students. Rod Butler motioned to approve the ESS Budget Revision. This was seconded by Julie Bell.

COMMITTEE AND OTHER REPORTS

Reminder to parents that we have committee meetings that meet once per month. These committees are: reading, math, safety and PBIS, culturally responsive teaching and learning, writing and social. The purpose of these committees are to bring things back to the Site Based Council and ensure that we keep our work within our action plan at the forefront.

COUNCIL OPERATIONS

Staffing - Amanda Trent has been hired as a .7 interventionist. She is to work a full day for 70% of the remaining school year. This allows us to service more students who are behind grade level.

We currently have a .4 Special Education position available that will be posted in December. This position has been generated due to our student enrollment.

Instructional Assistant hours have been increased. There are about 560 hours still remaining. Current IA's have been asked to see if they would like to increase their hours. A full time IA position will be posted November/December.
